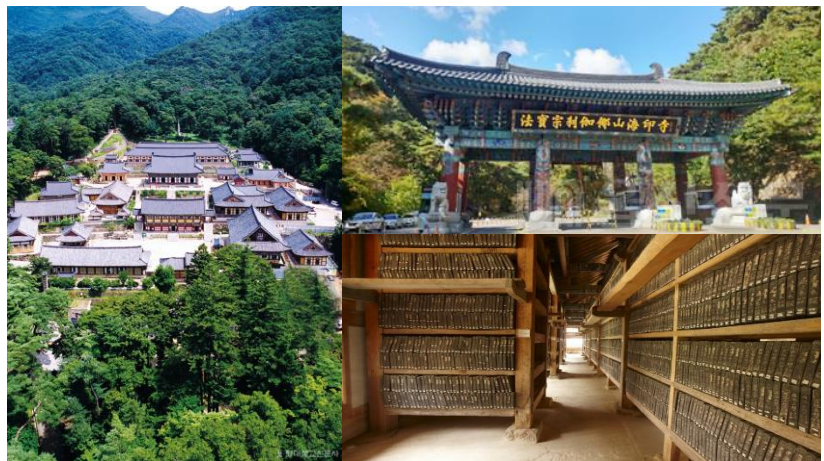

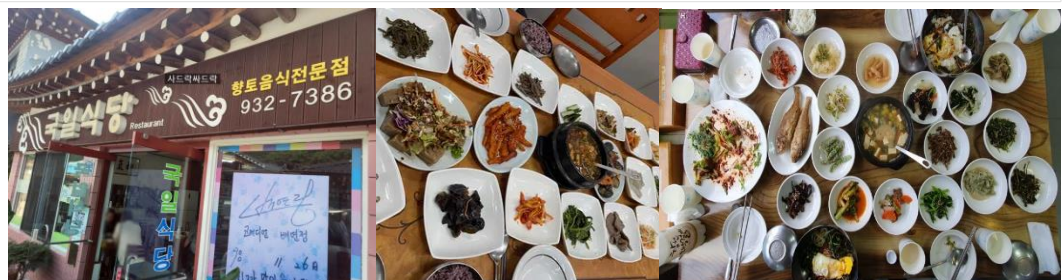
*The Temple of Haeinsa and the Depositories for the Tripitaka Koreana Woodblocks were made a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1995 and it designated as the Korean National Treasure No.32 with the whole of the Buddhist Scriptures carved onto 81,350 wooden printing blocks.

Haeinsa Temple, the head temple of the 12th religious district of the Jogye Order of Korean Buddhism, was designated as a Historic Site on December 21, 2009. The temple originated during the reign of King Aejang, the 40th monarch of the Silla Dynasty, when monks Suneung and Ijeong returned from Tang China and built a thatched hermitage on Mt. Gaya (also called Udu Mountain). While they were in deep meditation, Queen Aejang was afflicted with a skin disease, which they helped cure. Moved by this, the king visited Mt. Gaya, built a votive hall (Wondang), took care of state affairs there, and initiated the founding of Haeinsa Temple. Suneung began the construction, followed by Ijeong, and later the monk Gyoreon Daedeok became the head monk. In 918, when King Taejo founded the Goryeo Dynasty, the then head monk Heerang was honored for aiding him against Gyeon Hwon of Later Baekje. In gratitude, King Taejo designated Haeinsa as a national temple, making it the foremost Buddhist sanctuary in the nation. In 1398 (7th year of King Taejo of Joseon), the Tripitaka Koreana woodblocks, previously kept at Seonwonsa Temple on Ganghwa Island, were moved to Jicheonsa Temple, and the following year to Haeinsa, turning it into a center of national defense faith. Later, King Sejo expanded and renovated the depository halls for the scriptures (Janggyeonggak), and the royal queens, upholding his will, helped build the main hall complex (Geumdangbyeokwoo). During the reign of King Seongjong (the 9th Joseon king), the temple complex underwent major expansion. In more recent times, Haeinsa also served as a base for anti-Japanese Buddhist movements. Since its founding, the temple has suffered seven major fires, being reconstructed each time. Most of the current buildings date back to the late Joseon period and number over 50. From the original structures, only a few relics remain, such as the three-story stone pagoda and the stone lantern in front of the Daejeokgwangjeon (Main Hall of Great Silence and Light). Notably, Haeinsa is home to National Treasures such as the Tripitaka Koreana woodblocks and the Janggyeong Panjeon (depositories for the scriptures), as well as Treasures like the Stone Standing Buddha. Remarkably, these treasures survived multiple fires completely unscathed, preserving their original condition. Along with Tongdosa (Temple of the Buddha's relics) and Songgwangsa (Temple of the Sangha), Haeinsa is one of Korea's "Three Jewel Temples" and represents the Dharma (Law), making it a Law Treasure Temple. Today, it houses the Haein Buddhist Monastic College (Haein Chongnim), bustling with many students of Buddhism. It oversees around 150 affiliated temples and several hermitages, including Baengnyeongam, Hongjeam, Yaksuam, and Wondangam. For more details, please check at <http://www.haeinsa.or.kr/>.
